General Measures	 Everyone is required to wear a mask which covers one's nose and mouth on planes, buses, trains, and other forms of public transportation traveling into, within, or out of the United States and while indoors at U.S. transportation hubs such as airports and stations. Travelers are not required to wear a mask in outdoor areas of a conveyance (like on open deck areas of a ferry or the uncovered top deck of a bus). Cleans hand frequently Maintain a distance of at least 1 meter from others
Tourists Entry	 Free to Travel No Quarantine Full doses of vaccination For international arrivals, the CDC recommends that unvaccinated passengers are tested within 3 to 5days after travel and self-quarantine for 7days after travel. Passengers fully vaccinated with an FDA or WHO-approved vaccine do not have to quarantine but need to take a viral test within 3 to 5 days of arrival. If you are travelling domestically within the US, individual states and territories may have their own quarantine requirements.
